UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Public Works Director, Kittrel Braselman presented a comprehensive breakdown of the costs associated with both permanent and temporary speed humps during the meeting. After careful consideration and discussion, the group reached a consensus and voted in favor of proceeding with the installation of a permanent speed hump. The approved expenditure for this project amounts to \$1,866.00, which is expected to enhance road safety and reduce vehicle speeds in the designated area.
2. A vote was conducted to decide on the installation of a prominent warning sign at the location of 4852 Bristol Rock Rd. This sign is intended to alert drivers about the recent addition of a stop sign at the intersection nearby, aiming to enhance road safety and prevent potential accidents. The decision was influenced by several incidents reported at that intersection, highlighting the need for increased awareness among motorists. The proposed warning sign will be positioned strategically to ensure maximum visibility to all approaching vehicles, helping to reinforce the new traffic control measures in the area.

3. A request for speed humps on Elk Trail Dr and Wensley Rd.
 - a. A decision was made to table the request until the effectiveness of the speed humps installed on Bristol Rock Road can be thoroughly evaluated. Additionally, the group will explore the feasibility of installing stop signs at key intersections in the area as a further measure to enhance safety and discourage speeding.
4. Proposal to install a No Dumping sign, contingent upon verification from the city regarding its proposed placement. This is necessary as the area in question is classified as private property. Comprehensive research is currently being conducted to ensure that the sign adheres to all relevant city ordinances and regulations.
